

State Emergency Operations Center

- All disasters are local.
- If the city/county does not have the resources needed, then they request help from the state.
- The EOC is a coordination center for all state agencies.
- Besides resources, information is gathered for the Governor's office and other agencies.





The State Response to the 2023 Flooding Incident

- Flooding was expected to be heavy from all the snow over the winter.
- The EOC was activated to a level 2.






The State Response to the 2023 Flooding Inciden

- The Governor's office allocated funds to help with the flooding efforts.
- Over 3 million sandbags were distributed.

G0402-NIMS Overview for Senior Officials (National Incident Management System)

- Intended to be an introduction and overview of the Incident Command System (ICS) for elected officials and senior staff.
- The course covers basic ICS principles and how ICS is critically important for supporting effective emergency management.
- The course is designed to require a minimum of 3 ½ hrs. of instruction. More time is usually required for discussion, depending on the experience level of the class.

The Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)

- A non-disaster funding source for emergency management programs to enhance their already existing emergency management programs and activities.
- All public institutions of higher learning, cities, counties, and tribes located within the boundaries of the state of Utah who have established emergency management programs may apply for EMPG funds.

An Established Emergency Management Program

- Has existing plans which are promulgated and updated on a schedule.
- Has an emergency coordination or operations center with designated staff.
- Has an organizational structure that includes roles and responsibilities.
- Has the ability to facilitate communications and the coordination of resources in an emergency.
- Has dedicated funds and/or a budget specific to the Emergency Management Program, designating an emergency manager who is employed, and not just designated as other duties as assigned.
- This position cannot be contracted or held by an elected official.

The Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)

- Awards can increase or decrease based on the emergency manager's employment status (full-time, part-time, etc.), the jurisdiction's population size and the number of jurisdictions that apply each year.
- The jurisdiction is required to match the award at a minimum of 50%.
- In early spring, an announcement will be sent to any known emergency management programs on the state emergency management program managers email list. Applications are due annually in the spring.

The Direct Technical Assistance (DTA) Program

- Non-financial assistance to Utah communities and tribes to reduce disaster damage, build community resilience, and obtain and sustain successful mitigation.
- This is a service for communities that do not have the resources to do the work themselves.

- Community Outreach and Partnership Development


Who is Eligible
